ADJUTANT'S NOTES

The Post Executive Committee meeting held September 30, 2008 heard the minutes from the previous meeting and reports from finance, clubroom and gambling.

Members of the Anoka High School Girls Softball Team Booster Club visited the meeting to inquire about using our Post facilities to conduct a fundraiser tentatively projected for March 2009.

The Post Executive Committee approved the appointment of Paul Adler as the Post Gambling Manager and will recommend approval to the Post General Membership.

The Executive Committee reviewed all requests for donations and those approved were recommended for approval to the Post General Membership.

A joint meeting of the Post, Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion was held prior to the normal meetings to recognize the Boys and Girls Staters and their parents. Post Commandeer Cliff Newman who is also the Post Boys State Chairman introduced the three boys present Lance Myren, Ryan Hickey and Adam Schmidt who spoke of their experiences at Boys State this past summer. The boys unable to attend due to school activities were: Brad Sermon, Keegan McMahon, Jacob Nessman and Gordan Beaman. Hickey and Schmidt are from Andover High School and were sponsored by Anoka Post 102. Newman then introduced Kathy Zwerdling, Girls State Chairperson who mentioned the three girls sponsored by the Auxiliary were unable to attend due to school activities. They were: Angela Crawford, Sara Gorsugh and Deb Turney. All the students selected to attend Boys and Girls State are outstanding young people very involved in high school sports, choir, theater, orchestra and the National Honor Society. Their involvement also includes community work and church activities. Refreshments were served and the Post, Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion adjourned to their respective meetings.

The Post General Membership meetings held October 7, 2008 heard the minutes of those previous meetings and reports from Post Officers and committee chairmen.

Gambling Manager, Wayne Wallace, reported on the Compliance Review Inspection conducted by the Minnesota Gambling Control Board on September 18, 2008. Any areas requiring corrective action were primarily invoices to substantiate expenditures. No major areas of concern were noted.

Adjutant reported Post member Charles Sell had passed away since the last meeting.

First Vice Commander Gregg Werbowski reported (595) members are signed for 2009. We are currently (59) members behind one year ago. If you are still an unpaid member for 2009, please submit your dues as soon as possible to help your Post get back on track in membership.

Commander Newman mentioned the Post Executive Committee recommended approval of Paul Adler as the Post Gambling Manager. The Post General Membership, by motion, approved the appointment of Adler. No official change can take place until Adler receives his Gambling Manager license.



Post member Matt Berens mentioned he has been elected president of the Anoka Chapter 102 Legion Riders. The group will meet at Post 102 the 3rd Wednesday of each month. Any American Legion Family member, owning a motorcycle, is encouraged to join.



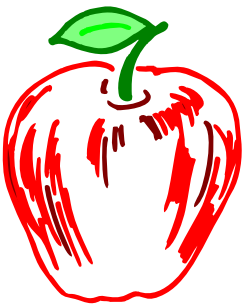

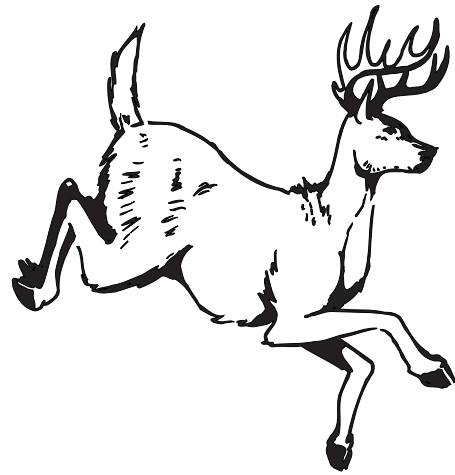
